The new boring Pennacchio Argentato July 17 - Hugust 21

Midway Contemporary Art is pleased to announce *The new boring*: the US debut of Pennacchio Argentato. *The new boring* is an installation of photographs and mixed media sculptures by the collaborative team of artists Pasquale Pennacchio and Marisa Argentato. Their project at Midway presents three lurching gray slabs that establish a relationship to the body through their scale, postures and their steel grab rails. Having a familiar aura of neither being objects, nor monuments, these mute forms exist in a quasi-anthropomorphic state. Austerely installed within the gallery, they further their connection to minimalism for visitors accustomed to such installation practices. But, like much of Pennacchio Argentato's previous sculptural and photographic-based work, these seemingly monolithic forms are in reality fairly sophisticated counterfeits, offering up a version of minimalist muscle by way of Bowflex® and slant step. Paired with each of the sculptures are photographs of a young, tanned, and muscle-toned Arnold Schwarzenegger that suggest a steroid induced aberration of classical ideals of form. Transparent formal connections are established between these and their three dimensional counterparts. The oxymoronic and self-deprecating title, *The new boring*, further suggests that a planned obsolescence has been built into the very design of these heterodox forms.

Pasquale Pennacchio (b. 1979) and Marisa Argentato, (b. 1977) are currently based in Naples, Italy.
